


### Q1 Do you live in superior?



### Q2 If you live in superior, how long?



### Q3 What is your family status?





**Q5 On a scale of 1-5, how supportive of the town hall expansion are you (1 the least, 5 the most supportive)**





The Town Manager and members of the Board are simply using the development as a reason to expand the footprint and budget of the Town to embellish themselves. The Board should direct staff to be more creative and cost efficient in its delivery of services. Lease or buy the Sports Authority building. Put the Sheriff's back into the fire station or the Safeway center. Allow staff to telecommute. This Board has gone overboard with its agenda on community spaces (e.g. Eldorado K8 park and Town Center sports fields) and all of the soft services such as nature walks, bird watching, fly-fishing and tree climbing classes, etc. All of this is cost and scope creep that provide little return to residents. Kevin Ryan put together a simple survey in a matter of hours. Since most of the Town Board are unwilling to engage residents in informal public settings, I encourage this virtual type of community outreach.
