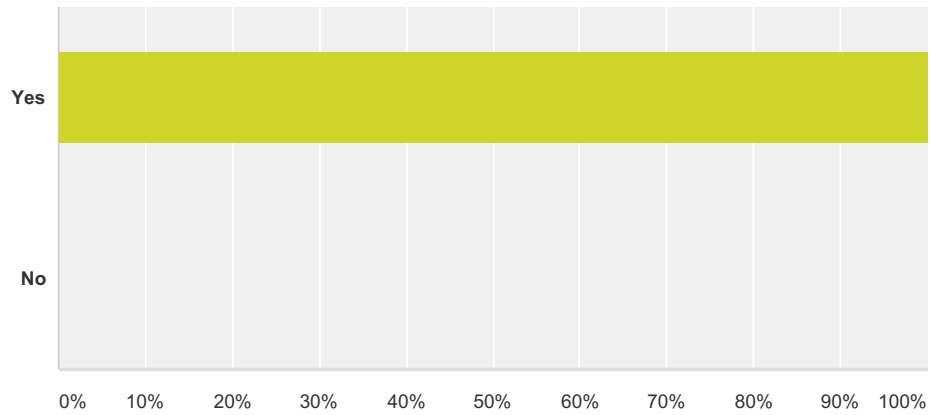


### Q1 Do you live in superior?

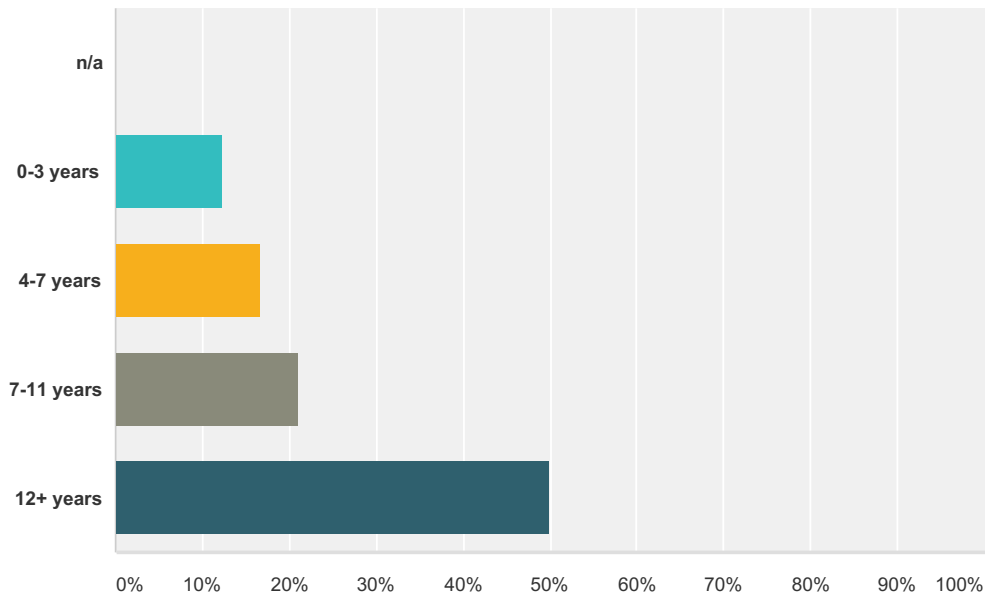

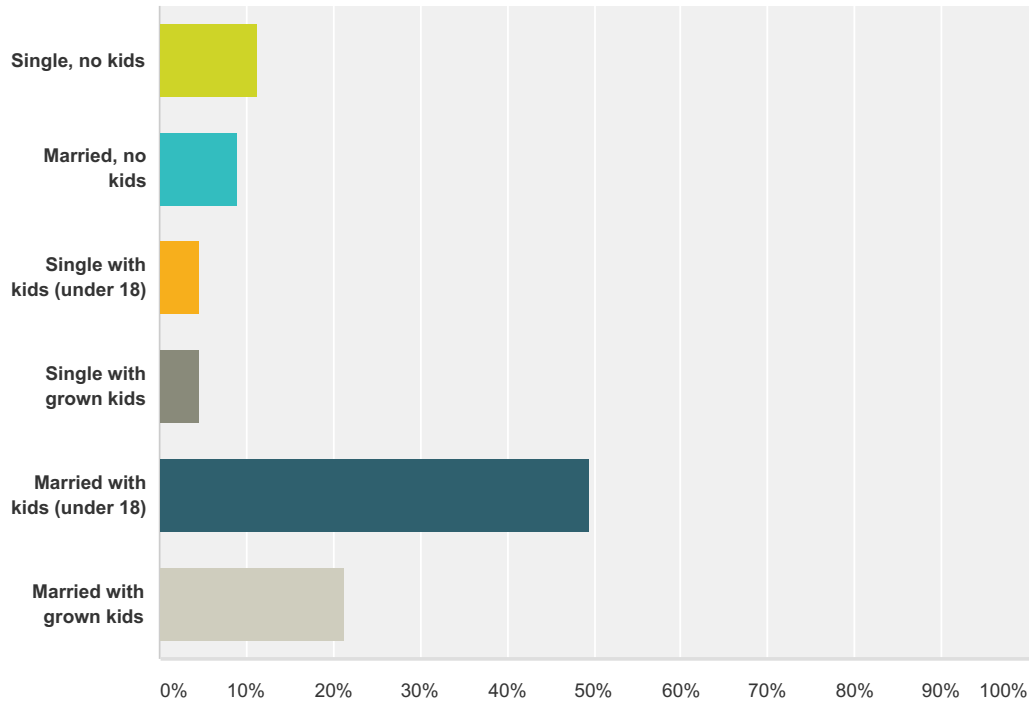

### Q3 What is your family status?

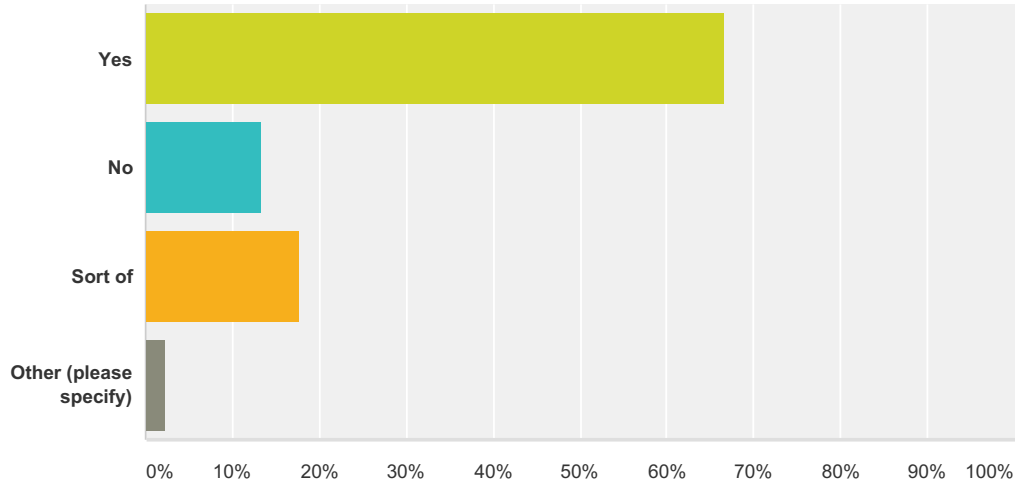

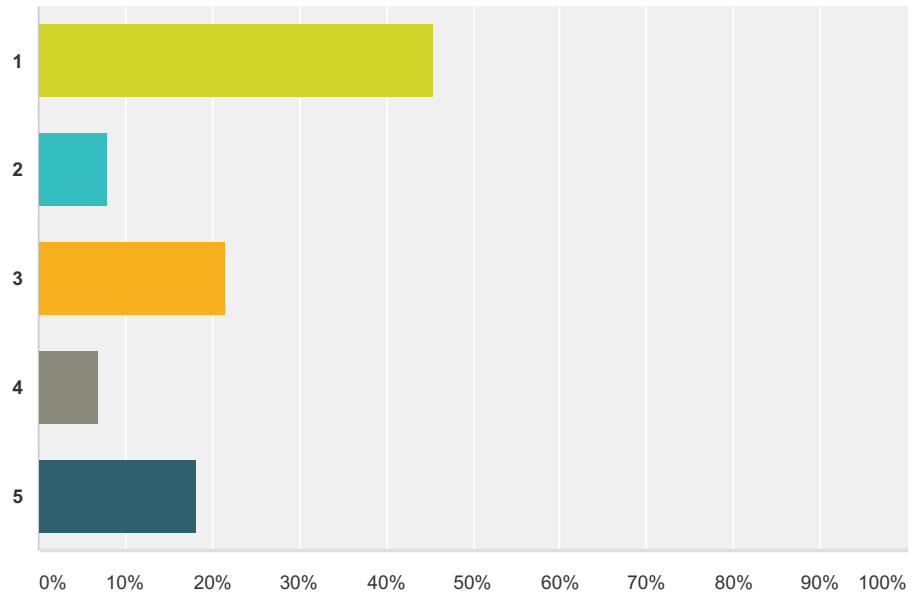

**Q5 On a scale of 1-5, how supportive of the town hall expansion are you (1 the least, 5 the most supportive)**

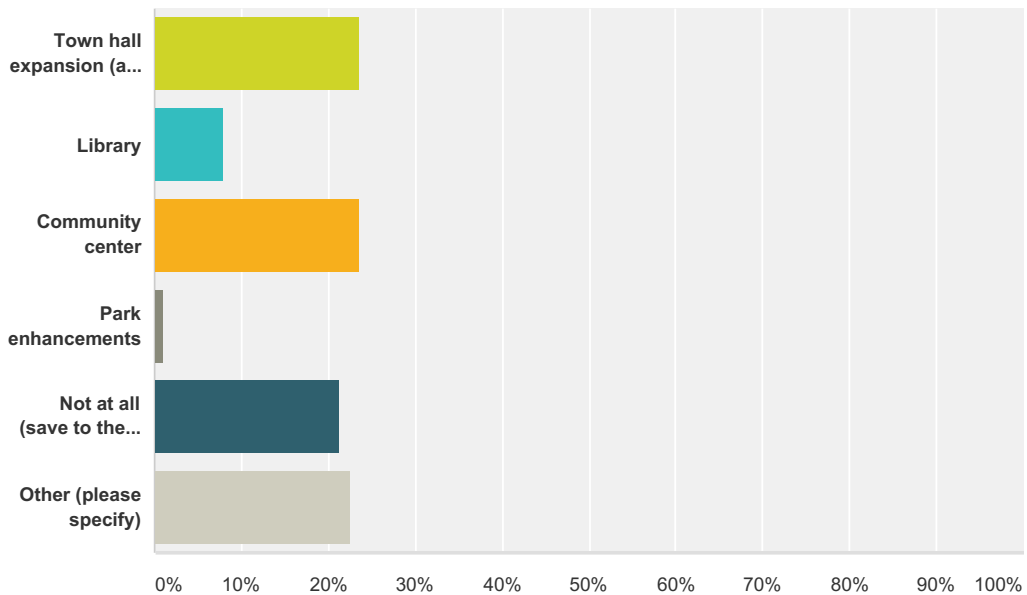

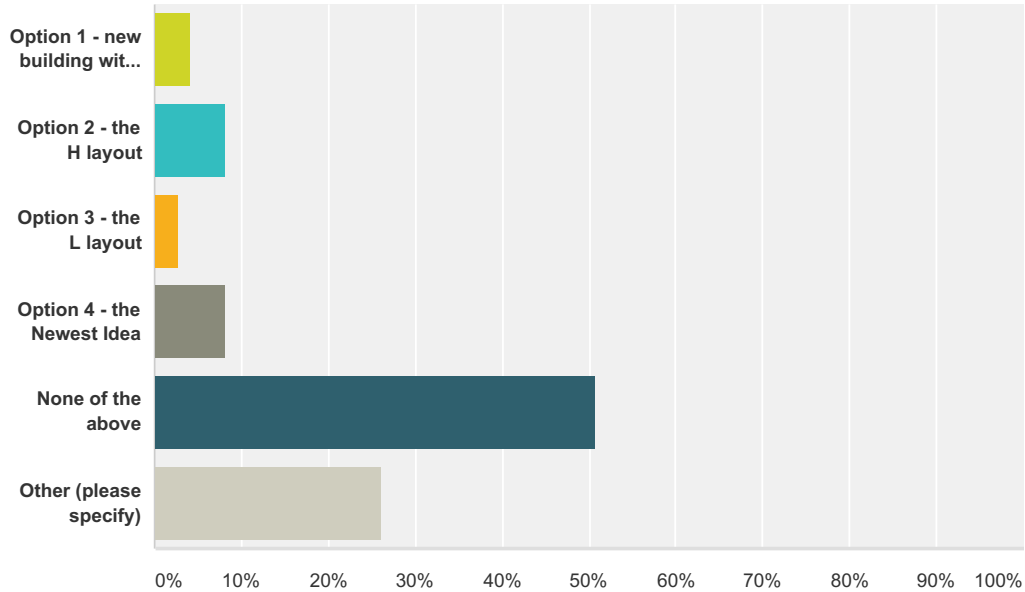
